My introduction to the industrial hygiene (IH) profession began in 1981 by the United States Air Force (USAF). I received training in Environmental Health Technology and entered the Bioenvironmental Engineering career field, which encompassed IH and environmental field sampling. I quickly came to the realization that I enjoyed the IH profession – an opportunity to be of service to people and have an impact on their well-being within the occupational setting. I completed seven years of active duty with USAF and retired from the Air National Guard. All of my military service time was dedicated to Bioenvironmental Engineering.

In the civilian world, I worked within an environmental and industrial hygiene laboratory for twelve years. My role there included industrial hygiene consulting services to customers; performed project management; conducted environmental field sampling; coordinated and reported IH analyses. Since 2000, I have been providing IH consultation services to EMC Insurance Companies' policyholders. The range of services varies from traditional IH to indoor environmental quality (IEQ) services. I also provide IH training to in-house personnel and policyholders.

The Accreditation Board for Engineering and Technology accredits both masters and bachelors programs in industrial hygiene. At the masters level, there are currently 27 schools with accredited MPH and/or MS programs in industrial hygiene. There are also 5 schools with accredited bachelors industrial hygiene programs. The only addition to last year's list is the Uniformed Services University for the Health Sciences. The University of Washington did not renew its accreditation.

My current position is at Michigan State University in the Office of Radiation, Chemical and Biological Safety as an industrial hygienist.

I appreciate the opportunity to assist the ABIH and to try to represent the general public on the board. I look at my role through three lenses. These varying perspectives flow from my three careers.

In my first career I was a news reporter for about 20 years. This included a time with NBC when I covered Watergate, the War in Lebanon and Three Mile Island. As a reporter I tried to ask the sort of questions that anyone would and to explain complicated matters in a way that most persons could understand.

In my second career I moved to advocacy. I spent 20 years as an attorney and consultant helping organizations deal with risks. I worked on things like the September 11th air disasters, environmental crimes, chemical safety, mad cow disease, SUV rollovers, silicone breast implants, the aftermath of the Valdez oil spill and five explosions at chemical plants and refineries. I learned how hard it is to assess and communicate about risks, particularly newly apprehended ones.

Now I am chairman of the National Center for Critical Incident Analysis, an independent, privately funded, civilian research entity that supports the National Defense University in Washington. I have written a study on lessons from the 2001 anthrax attacks and I am co-author of What is to be done? Emerging Perspectives on Public Responses to Bioterrorism (2002). One of the most interesting things I am doing is serving on the board of the Santa Fe Institute, an innovative scientific think tank.

I am committed to life-long learning. All my degrees were earned on a part-time basis while I worked full time. These include a law degree at Georgetown and masters degrees from Johns Hopkins (behavioral science), American University (political science) and Syracuse (interdisciplinary social science). My doctorate in public administration from the University of Southern California. ●

## Active Diplomates with Low Certification Numbers

Not too long ago, we had an inquiry as to how many CIHs with certification numbers < 1000 were still in active practice. A search of our data base revealed that it took fifteen years, from 1960-1975, to assign the first thousand certification numbers and 123 of those Diplomates are continuing in active practice. In the five years from 1976-1980, the next thousand numbers were awarded. 517 Diplomates in this group continue to maintain their certification.

## Reduction in Board Size and Term of Office

Recent Bylaws changes will reduce the Director term of office from six years to four. The size of the Board will also drop from its current nineteen Directors to eleven by the beginning of 2007. The eleven includes ten Diplomates and one Public Member who is elected for a two year term and may serve a total of two terms. In order to balance those retiring from the Board with those being elected, ABIH will alternately elect two and then three Diplomates each year. The slate of candidates comes from Diplomates who self nominate. The current Bylaws are available on the General Information page of the ABIH website ([www.abih.org](http://www.abih.org)). ●
